**F**rom the desk of Katie Carleo, Peer

**“It takes a village to raise a child.”**

Throughout the years of my life in the Catholic Church it has been the community around me that has helped shape me into who I am today. And as I journey forward I am now becoming part of the community, out stretching our hands to those around us to help them flourish and grow. Growing up in Pueblo, Colorado I was raised in the richness of the Catholic traditions at Our Lady of the Meadows. My family always had a strong presence in my life, and our family presence extended into our church life. My mother and father were always active and participated in many aspects of our church community. I grew up being the youngest member of the Social Justice and Environment committees. I can remember being just a tot and helping during the holidays to prepare meals for those less fortunate. It would be a snowy November night and my family would travel to the church. We would enter the hall where tables overflowed with foods of every kind, cranberries, mash potatoes, rolls, stuffing, veggies, turkey, ham, and of course pumpkin pie. My dad would always be in the kitchen counting and organizing the turkeys and hams that stuffed the refrigerator, and mom would be conducting traffic where everyone was working to gather each special part needed for a holiday meal. Then there was me, always anxious to help gather everything for the baskets, not quite understanding the significance of our actions, but being a part of the community. As the years went on my understanding and faith grew deeper in the church, and I found myself creating my own paths in our community.

Now as a senior at the University of New Mexico I have grown and flourished into a strong faithful person. When moving from Colorado I strengthened my roots as an independent woman and strive to embrace every new opportunity that lies around the corner. At turning the corner towards my last year at the University, preparing to graduate in Architecture, I took on the role of a Peer Campus Minister. I have joined the “village” in hopes of working with others to build and deepen our roots in faith. I am the Peer Campus Minister of Liturgy and Worship, and work to organize our mass traditions to allow us to experience God’s presence in our lives. I schedule all the Liturgical Ministers and help to train newly interested ministers. I also coordinate the Candlelight Mass and work in conjunction with the Newman Center’s Liturgy and Worship staff. Currently I am beginning to establish a project called YTW. This is the “Year of the Word,” and we are focusing on what other expressions of the word can be used to help us see, hear, and feel God’s message. I am creating a new committee that will focus on the word being declared each Sunday, and how we can proclaim that expression. I encourage everyone to reflect and consider how they may contribute more to our community, and if you may be interested in the liturgical ministry.

- **PAPER or PLASTIC?** 4 trillion plastic bags are manufactured annually worldwide. 100 billion plastic and 10 billion paper bags are manufactured in the U.S. 1% of that number is recycled. Paper doesn’t break down a whole lot faster than plastic. Plastic is non-biodegradable, breaks up into smaller pieces of plastic, which are ingested by marine life or deposited on our shores.
