Commissioning Liturgical ministers

Extraordinary ministers of liturgy are critical parts of the celebration of the Eucharist. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states that each liturgical role should be solely and completely performed by the proper minister. (GIRM §91) Thus the ordained priest or deacon should only perform the ministry that is appropriate to each.

To fulfill these extraordinary roles at the Eucharist, the GIRM suggests that lay ministers be commissioned to assist with functions such as lector, acolyte or extraordinary minister of the Eucharist. Roles such as usher, sacristan, musicians or others also should be commissioned to assist the Assembly in offering praise and glory to God.

The role of the assembly is, primarily, to fully participate in a conscious, active and full way both in body and mind in the entire celebration. (GIRM §18) However, we, the Assembly individually participate by exercising the various roles that complement the roles of the ordained ministry.

The priest and deacon are ordained as permanent liturgical ministers. Lay ministers are *commissioned* to fill specific roles for a specified period of time. After appropriate training, selected volunteers are called before the Assembly and designated for the specific roles to serve in their roles. (*Redemptionis Sacramentum* §155)

There is no specific directive for how long a period extraordinary ministers should be commissioned, a year is an appropriate length. And frequently parishes see lay ministers serve for an indeterminate period of time – often for years on end – this doesn't meet the purposes behind the commissioning. Commissioning lay ministers is a witness to the whole community that its members are serving them in these special roles. It testifies to the call of all to serve! The length of the commission allows laity to know that the period of service comes to an end and can either be renewed or a new role can begin.

Here at Newman, though we have not regularly commissioned or re-commissioned our lay ministers, we have an extraordinary number of ministers who have been willing to serve indefinitely in their roles and have not held back their service.

However, in order to open new opportunities for parishioners and offer fresh ones for current lay ministers, the liturgy committee is setting up a schedule to have lay ministers commissioned for a period of a year at a time. This will give witness to the community of the call to serve and clearly state the lay person's role in the Assembly. The person commissioned will also have a clear direction for serving in this ministry and know that the community has called him or her to this role.

So then, the liturgy committee invites you to reflect on the role of ministries in the Assembly and consider the call

to serve.

Serving as a minister during liturgy does require full and active participation, not a passive presence at the Eucharist. It means the minister is actively involved in the worship. This can be a paradigm change in one's worship. Instead of watching, one is involved and needed during the liturgical action. The sense of belonging is the difference between being a guest of the Assembly and being a rightful member, taking ownership of what occurs and is experienced during the Eucharist. The call by the Assembly to serve is not only a challenge to put yourself at the service of another, but also a challenge to experience liturgy as one's own action, as one's own life!

As we prepare for the commissioning of lay ministries, we ask for our current ministers to consider their roles and renewing their commitments – or alternatively to consider a new lay ministry role. Prayerfully consider if God is calling you to serve in this way: if not you, then who? If not now, then when? If not this service, then what service?
