From the desk of Dominic Bernardi, Director of Development

While I've been around the parish since 1996, I'm the new kid on the block when it comes to the members of the Aquinas Newman Center staff. I have now been in this newly created ministry for about 30 days as a result of a need that was identified about a year ago by Fr. Tom and his Parish Finance Council.

Why a Development Ministry? To answer that question we first have to understand that the Newman Center considers itself to be a stewardship parish. It is sometimes easier to discuss something by first saying what it is not; that is, that stewardship is not just raising money a few times a year for the parish's operations. Simply put, stewardship is a way of life and not an appeal for funds. As a parish we behave on the premise that everything that we have is a gift from God and that we are stewards, or managers, of the many gifts God has given to us. As Christian stewards, we recognize that all that we are – all that we have – belongs to God, and we are accountable to Him for the use of all things. Therefore, we live and give as Christians, generously sharing our God-given gifts of time, talent and treasure in proportion to the blessings that each of us has received from God. We can look upon stewardship as a three legged stool, the three legs representing time, talent and treasure. As with the stool, each is equally important for, without all three legs, the stool can not stand upright. Of the three legs of the stool, Development focuses on Treasure, the other two legs being addressed through our three other primary ministries that are spiritual in nature; campus ministry, religious formation and liturgy and music.

Development fulfills three important roles in a stewardship parish. This ministry directs and manages the acquisition of monetary gifts needed to support the spiritual ministries' activities; works with the Parish Finance Council to ensure the husbanding and distribution of funds are in keeping with the strategic needs of the parish and, finally, communicating to the parish in a transparent manner the activities related to the first two roles.

For those that don't know me, you can find me in the choir at the 4:30 Saturday afternoon Mass. I have had a fruitful secular life working in the fields of mass communication (radio/television), finance (banking) and management. I own two companies that specialize in management and business ethics consulting. I chaired of the Parish Pastoral Council during the late 1990's and then later chaired the Parish Finance Council, serving on both as a member for almost 13 consecutive years. Now, I have been given the special opportunity of sharing my gifts with my friends and associates of the Aquinas Newman Center each week from Tuesday through Thursday from my new office adjacent to the rear entrance to the Center.
