CONFIRMATION - For adults and high school students.

BAPTISM OF CHILDREN - For registered parishioners only. Check with the office for scheduled dates. One preparation sessions required. Parents and godparents should attend classes before the birth of the child to be baptized, if possible. Register in the office.

RECONCILIATION - By arrangement. Communal Service as announced. Also, on Saturdays: from 3:30 - 4:00pm.

MARRIAGE - For registered parishioners. Requires six (6) months preparation. Contact the office for details.

From the desk of Kyle Kemp, Director of Religious Formation



Greetings of God's Presents and Presence,

This year's catechetical theme is "The Gift of Formation." Our materials and our programs are gifts of faith, gifts of community, gifts of belonging, and gifts of celebrating our unique Catholic identity. They are simply God's special presents and presence in our lives.

The registration packet for 2009-2010 programs is now available in the Gathering Space and on the ANC website (www.aquinasnm.org). We have decided not to mail them this year in order to save on increasing printing and mailing costs.

As we are no longer collaborating with St. Charles Borromeo on religious formation programs, we have spent the summer developing programs which replace those hosted at SCB; complement those already offered at ANC; and which reflect our community's unique Dominican heritage and charism.

The 2009-2010 religious formation programs for children and youth include:

- ◆ **Faith in Life** – This program will continue to be offered on Sunday afternoons and remains our primary model of faith formation for children, youth, and adults. While retaining its innovative approach to faith formation, its content and structure have been refined to smooth the rough edges experienced last year, especially in the youth levels.
- ◆ **Tuesday Night Alive** – A new mid-week formational program for kids in grades 1-8. It will gather all ages to explore aspects of the Catholic faith reflecting the four pillars of the catechism.
- ◆ **Children's Liturgy of the Word** – Proclaiming the Sunday readings in age-appropriate language, this program helps children better understand the Liturgy of the Word.
- ◆ **Early Childhood** – Designed for children ages 3-5, this new program will help children better understand and articulate God's active and loving presence in the world in which they live.
- ◆ **Sacramental Preparation** – Those preparing to celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and/or Confirmation will continue to reflect the vision of our faith and our community.
- ◆ **Youth Mission** – A week long youth mission trip has been added to better assist high school students understand how their Catholic faith and presence can transform others and, in the process, themselves.

I encourage families to discuss how they will experience the gift of formation this year. Our faith calls all of us to actively participate in the ongoing formation and deepening of our faith and the goal of the religious formation office is to develop programs and activities which help families make that a reality.
