**FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
JULY 11, 2010**

Luke 10:25-37.

The lawyer puts an important question to Jesus, but it is insincere because he is really posing the question to “test” Jesus. Jesus takes his question at face value and gives a right and all-embracing answer about how we “inherit eternal life.” We must make love of God and neighbor the guiding focus of our lives here and now. In our legal culture we are very aware that law cannot legislate love or compassion. Yet loving God and others and acting compassionately *are* God’s law. The good Samaritan parable illustrates this kind of love. Our challenge: to go *this far* in our loving.

- What do I find challenging about Jesus’ reply to “who is my neighbor?”
- How far have I gone in loving God?
- How far have I gone in loving my neighbor?
