SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, JULY 25, 2010 Luke 11:1-13

In this gospel Jesus “teach[es] us to pray.” Most important, he teaches us to whom we pray: God who is a generous and caring Father. He also teaches us for what we should pray: not just for immediate needs (“daily bread”) but, more important, for ultimate needs: the furthering of God’s kingdom, the gift of forgiveness, and protection from anything that would take us from God. It is persistence in prayer that brings us deeper into our relationship with God and opens us to receive these “good gifts” God offers us.

From The Liturgy Committee: “Did you know?”

The term “Ordinary Time” may be misleading. In the context of the liturgical year the term “ordinary” does not mean “usual or average.” Ordinary here means “not seasonal.” Ordinary Time is that part of the Liturgical Year that lies outside the seasons of Lent-Easter and Advent-Christmas. In Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect but in all its aspects. The use of the term “Ordinary Time” was used before the Second Vatican Council, but it was not until after the council that the term was officially used to designate the period between Epiphany and Lent, and the period between Pentecost and Advent. After the new Catholic Calendar took effect in 1969, the older designations, “Season After Epiphany” and “Season After Pentecost,” were no longer used.

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green, a sign of hope.
